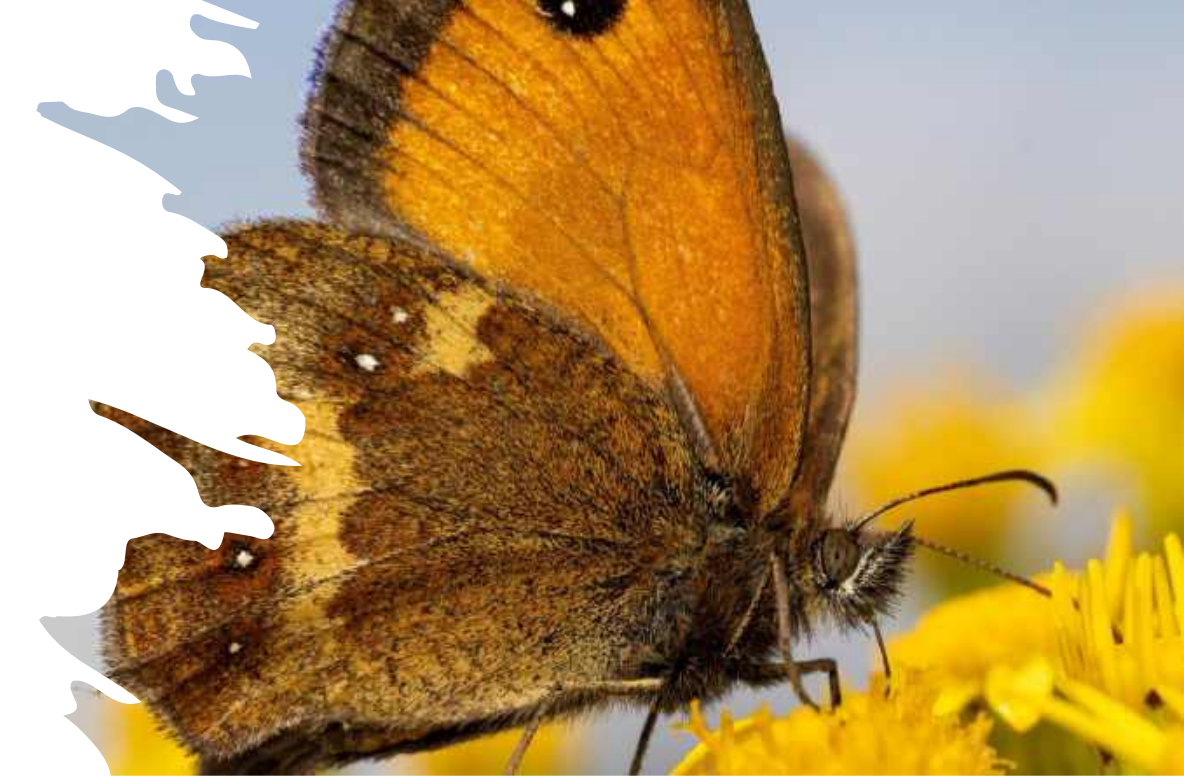

Puttenham Common 2024

Breeding Birds

70 species of bird recorded in total

736 breeding territories found of 46 species in the 115 ha of area intensively covered by the surveys. Highlights of the surveys included confirmation of breeding territories for Nightjar, Cuckoo, Woodcock, Woodlark, Spotted Flycatcher, Common Redstart and Tree Pipit.

9 Red listed species of conservation concern were recorded attempting to breed on site – Cuckoo, Woodcock, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Marsh Tit, Mistle Thrush, Spotted Flycatcher, Tree Pipit, Greenfinch, Redpoll

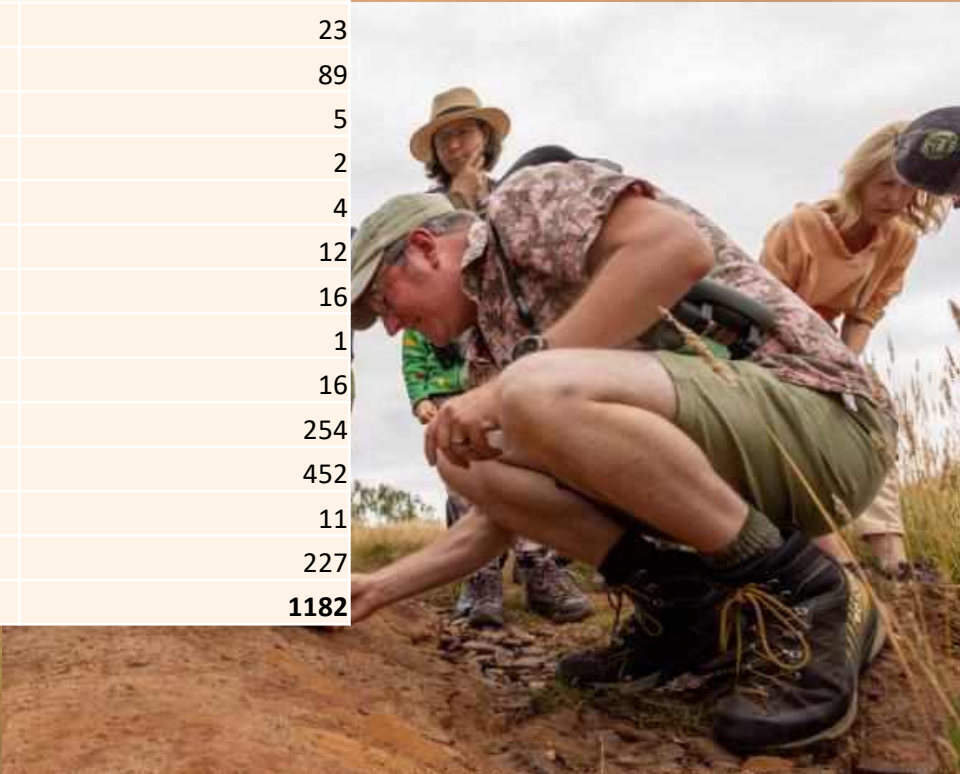
14 Amber listed species of conservation concern were recorded attempting to breed on site – Stock Dove, Wood Pigeon, Nightjar, Tawny Owl, Honey-buzzard, Sparrowhawk, Kestrel, Willow Warbler, Common Whitethroat, Wren, Song Thrush, Common Redstart, Dunnock, Bullfinch

7 Species attempting to breed have special protection during the breeding season under Schedule 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), the highest protection status in England – Barn Owl, Crossbill, Firecrest, Honey Buzzard, Kingfisher, Red Kite, Woodlark.

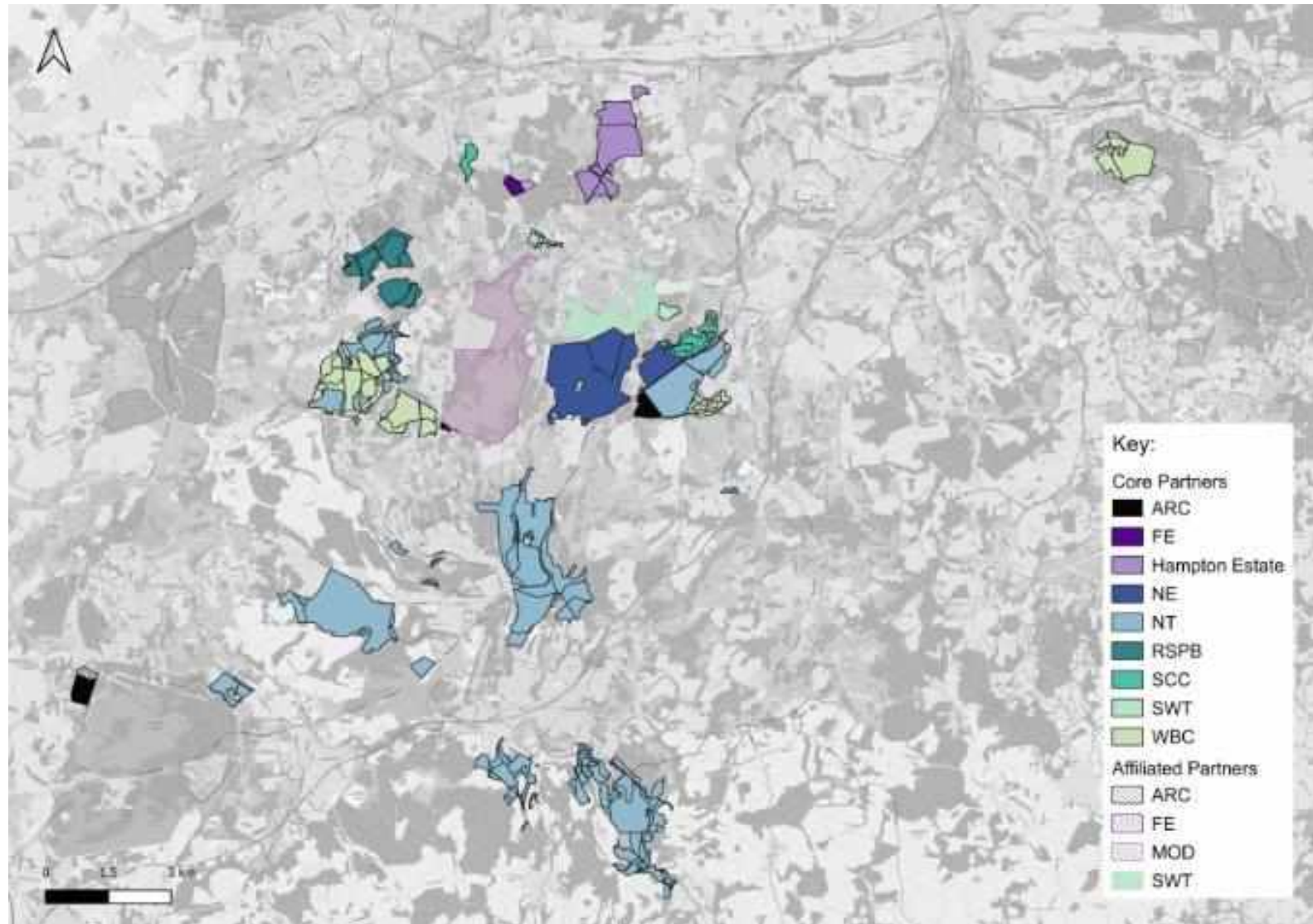
